Interpretations, Amendments and Violations

1. The Polk County Agricultural Fair Association management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto, otherwise arising out of, connected with or incidental to the fair. 2. The management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as it in its judgment may deem advisable.
2. Any person who violates any of the following or special rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the gov3a. Second prem is competition.
3. Livestock Registration - open class/FFA livestock entries are due Monday, June 26. Send entries to brian@grunhovd.com. Livestock includes cattle, swine, sheep and goats. Livestock must be stalled by 7 p.m., July 5 , with animal verification 5. Entries will
4. Entries will be accepted from Polk County and neighboring counties, except 4-H Club and school exhibits, providing these same counties reciprocate in admitting Polk County exhibitors to the fair.
5. Entries for premiums in the individual lots of grain, field seed, fruits, or forage shall not be permitted to appear as parts of collections.
6. NO ARTICLE TO BE REMOVED FROM FAIR GROUNDS UNTIL 8:00 P.M. LAST DAY DERED
7. All articles submitted for exhibition must be the property of the exhibitor, must be made, manufactured or raised during the past twelve months by the exhibitor, not-withstanding livestock.
8. Livestock must be the actual property or have a qualified lease signed and accepted by the exhibitor. The age of the animal is the actual qualified age of the animal. A certificate of registration is required from parties entering purebred or bull blood stock.
9. Purebred animals under 1 year of age will not be required to show certificate of registry but the
exhibitor of such animal shall be required to give a certified statement that both sire and dam of such animals are properly registered purebreds.
10. All money prizes will be paid by check of the association and mailed to the exhibitor as soon as possible after the close of the fair. Checks must be cashed with
exhibitors.
11. The fair management will use diligence to ensure the safety of livestock or articles entered for exhibition, after their arrival and placement, but under no circumstances will it be responsible for or arising from, any animal or article of exhibi tion, and the exhibitor shall indemnify the fair and management thereof, against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.
12. No person will be permitted to tack or post any advertising material, cards, poster, flyers, etc., or to sell or give subscription for magazines and papers, except within their place of business. 14. Any interference by exhibitors to influence or dictate the decision of the judges will be sufficient tion, and should be reported to the secretary through the superintendent of the division. 15. The Fair Board reserves the right to premium listing.
13. No prizes will be paid on exhibits not in the premium listing.
14. License to solicit orders for and deliver articles of food, tobacco, soft drinks or other articles of merchandise; to restaurants, refreshment stands, or exhibits upon the fair grounds must be 18. Exhibitor's must keep th 18. Exs in good and neat condition, stock, stalls and spection from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.
15. Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves when their stock will be judged. Stock must be in the show ring promptly after being called and any exhibitor failing to comply with this order will be ruled out of competition. 20. Sires, dams and groups entered as such must them, but the progeny of animals may be shown simply as proof of their breeding qualities without such ownership.
16. 4H or FFA members may show their respective animals in the Open Class Livestock show.

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## LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS - All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhi bition and at least once daily during the exhibition.

- Prior to entering a public exhibition, animals must meet the requirements for exhibition, importation, and intrastate movement as defined by the Board.
- All out-of-state animals must meet Minnesota importation requirements.
- No animal may enter or be at a public exhibition that is showing clinical signs of any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts.
Always check with exhibition management for additional requirements.

EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS

HORSES - All horses except for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam, must be negative to an official Equine Infectious Anemia (Coggins) test within 12 months prior to the opening date of an exhibition.
DOGS - Dogs four months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of rabies vaccination documenting that the dog is currently vaccinated for rabies.
CATTLE - Cattle must be officially identified prior to exhibition. The following are approved official identification for cattle. Official ID may not be removed from an animal once it is applied. 1. National Uniform Ear Tagging System (NUES)

POULTRY EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS - All chickens, turkeys, and game bird at exhibitions, except baby poultry, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band (http://bahwp/media/poultry-leg-band.jpg).
Young poultry that are too small to band can be exhibited as a
group if the Hatchery Permit number or NPIP number is written on the box.
At exhibitions, all chickens, turkeys, game birds, and hatching eggs from these birds must be accompanied by a certificate or test chart approved by the Board to show compliance with the following requirements:

1. Pullorum-typhoid - origination from a hatchery or breeding flock that is classified pullorumtyphoid clean under the plan; or be negative to pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to the opening date of exhibition.
2. Mycoplasma gallisepticum and Mycoplasma synoviae - all turkeys and turkey hatching eggs must originate from a hatchery or breeding flock that is classified Mycoplasma gallisepticum clean and Mycoplasma synoviae clean under the plan; or be negative to a Mycoplasma gallisepticum and Mycoplasma synoviae test within Mycoplasma synoviae test within
90 days prior to the opening date of exhibition.

Annual Exhibition of Fertile Poultry Association of Polk County Charlotte Borseth, Superintendent, 945-3407
All poultry except waterfowl and pigeons must be negative to the rapid whole-blood plate test for pullerum and typhoid diseases applied within 90 days prior to the opening date of exhibition providing that no test shall be required on poultry originating directly from parent stock tested and found negative within the preceding 12 months. An officially recognized form signed by an authorized agent must be presented to show compliance with this section. Official forms from other states shall be approved by the official agency of state or origin. Each bird shall be identified and band number recorded on the official form. PLEASE NOTE: ALL EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO SUPPLY THEIR OWN CAGE LOCK FOR POULTRY AND

## RABBITS.

1. Exhibitors are urgently requested to read the rules, as they will be enforced and ignorance of them may prove fatal to successful competition.
2. Entry fee must accompany the entry in each case and transportation charges must be fully paid.
3. All birds entered for competition should be listed with poultry Supt. by July 4, 2023.
4. All birds entered for competition must be entered singly.
5. No exhibitors to show more than 2 entries in each class. 6. No exhibitors to show more than 16 entries combined. 7. Terms used are defined as follows:
